These items plug and clog sewer mains. break aerators in the lagoons, clog sewer pumps in lift stations... and all these breaks cost the District in repairs.

The Operator has been cleaning the lagoon aerators of "flushable wipes". They are **NOT** flushable.

So PLEASE remember.... Flushable wipes are NOT FLUSHABLE. The only paper product that should be flushed is toilet paper.

4 Accepting Credit Cards:

We are now able to accept credit cards. There will be a surcharge of 5% per transaction. This charge is for payment by credit/debit card only. You will still have the option to pay by check or cash without any additional fee. We can email your invoice to you and you can pay via email.

Water system upgrade:

1) The District has gone to bid to find a contractor for the water system upgrade. Construction should start mid to end of October.

2) Construction will include another water tank, well and chemical feed pumps, Loop in Dead-end mains to improve flow along with several other things.

The Berkadia loan payoff:

The District has an old water loan from 1984 (Berkadia Loan). The Berkadia loan was due to be paid off in 2025 (41 years). There were late and missed payment before 2017 and is the reason it is taking longer to pay off. The Berkadia loan is being refinanced with a Coal Severance Tax loan. The loan amount will be \$70,262. The Coal Loan will be paid off in 2025 and will save the District \$21,604 over the next 5 years.

Fire Hydrant repairs and replacements:

Over the past year Rusty has repaired 4 and replaced 4 of the broken fire hydrants throughout the system. The cost to fix/replace these fire hydrants were \$21,501.30. If the District had to call a contractor to replace the fire hydrants would have been approximately \$34,700.00 which does not include repairing 4 hydrants. Saving the district \$13,198.70.

\rm Generator

Influent lift station was repaired by an employee for \$40.00 (labor). A new generator would have cost the District approximately \$45,000. Saving the District \$44,960.00.
